# PRESS RELEASE

## Lisle-Woodridge Fire District

### Structure Fire

At 03:04 hours on Monday November 9, 2015, the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District was notified by way of a 911 call from a resident reporting smoke in the building with a possible fire. The incident location was 7050 Newport Drive in Woodridge Ill.

A General Alarm assignment was immediately dispatched by DU-COMM sending four (4) engines, three (3) ladder trucks, two (2) medic units, and three (3) chief officers to the scene, for a total of 26 personnel. Lisle-Woodridge Fire District was assisted by Darien-Woodridge Fire District and Downers Grove Fire Department.

The first unit arrived on the scene at 03:10 hours and reported heavy smoke showing from 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of a 2 story attached townhome. Residents of building had evacuated upon arrival.

Fire companies immediately deployed hose lines to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. Roof ventilated, fire under control within 15 minutes of arrival. Search and rescue operations were negative, extensive salvage and overhaul operations conducted in the fire building and adjoining units.

Fire units remained on the scene until approximately 06:50 hours performing salvage duties and overhauling the burned areas of the structure. The building was determined to be uninhabitable by the Village of Woodridge Building Department. Several occupants were displaced by the fire and arrangements for lodging were handled with the assistance of 1-800 Board-Up. Remaining occupants were not allowed back into structure until building was re-evaluated by the Woodridge Building Department.

The Lombard, Wheaton, and Naperville Fire Departments provided coverage at Lisle-Woodridge Fire District stations during the incident.

There were no injuries to any civilian or emergency responders during this incident.

The cause of the fire is under investigation at this time; however, the fire appears to be accidental. No further information is available at the time.
