# PRESS RELEASE

## Lisle-Woodridge Fire District

### Structure Fire

At 21:56 hours on Tuesday November 10, 2015, the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District was notified by way of a 911 call from a resident reporting an out of control kitchen fire. The incident location was 2611 Beau Bien Court West in Lisle, Ill 60532.

A General Alarm assignment was immediately dispatched by DU-COMM sending four (4) engines, three (3) ladder trucks, two (2) medic units, and three (3) chief officers to the scene, for a total of 26 personnel. Lisle-Woodridge Fire District was assisted on scene by Lombard Fire Department, Downers Grove Fire Department and Wheaton Fire Department.

The first unit arrived on the scene at 22:00 hours reported heavy smoke showing from the front of a 2 story multi-family residence. Initial size-up noted heavy fire in the rear of the building extending to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. Lisle PD reported the occupants of the fire unit were accounted for. Residents of the adjoining units were evacuated by Fire Department personnel.

Fire companies immediately deployed hose lines to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. Roof was ventilated, and the fire was under control within 20 minutes of arrival. Search and rescue operations were negative, extensive salvage and overhaul operations were conducted in the fire building and adjoining units.

Fire units remained on the scene for several hours performing salvage duties and overhauling the burned areas of the structure. Several occupants were displaced by the fire and arrangements for lodging were handled by the property management company with assistance from the American Red Cross.

The Downers Grove, Wheaton, and Naperville Fire Departments provided coverage at Lisle-Woodridge Fire District stations during the incident.

There were no injuries to any civilian or emergency responders during this incident.

The cause of the fire is under investigation at this time; however, the fire appears to be accidental. No further information is available at the time.
