## **Lisle-Woodridge Fire District**

### **Multiple Victim Incident**

At 1531 hours on 23 September 2017, the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District was notified by way of a 911 call from Benedictine University reporting a medical emergency and was dispatched to 5560 College road in Lisle.

An ALS engine company and a medic were dispatched for a heat related emergency. When the ALS engine arrived on scene at 1535 hours, there were 3 people in need of medical attention.

The response was upgraded to include 2 additional ambulances, another engine company and a Battalion Chief.

While FD personnel were treating the initial 3 victims, more victims began to request help, all suffering from heat related emergencies.

At the conclusion of the incident, a total of 14 victims were treated, of which 9 were transported to Edward Hospital in Naperville.

Lisle-Woodridge Fire District units were assisted on the scene by the Darien-Woodridge Fire District, Downers Grove Fire Department and the Naperville Fire Department. The Lombard and Bolingbrook Fire Departments provided coverage at Lisle-Woodridge Fire District stations.
